NAPLAN 2019

This year's NAPLAN results are in. Below is a quick overview of our school's performance. Please note that at the time of writing this newsletter, individual writing results were not available to schools.

Year 3 NAPLAN results were above state average in reading, writing, grammar and punctuation and numeracy. There was significant growth in these areas from the past few years.

Year 5 NAPLAN showed growth across most areas which was pleasing to see. However, some growth areas don't reflect the growth that we are seeing from students in the classroom day to day. In order to get a clearer picture of this, we will be looking at **UNSW External Assessments** to help identify areas of development for our students. This will benefit not only Year 5 students in their final year and a half of Primary school, but also our Year 3 students who gain top 2 bands to ensure their growth is sustained over time.

Spelling fell below state average across Year 3 and Year 5. Pairing this result with our internal tests, the school will be looking at implementing a new spelling program in 2020 called **Sound Waves**. This program focuses on phoneme and grapheme sounds and has all students in Year I to 6 learning the same sounds with word lists differentiated to their year levels. Mrs Lofthouse and I have already engaged in professional learning around this program.

Premiers Priorities



This graph shows the hard work of our teachers in delivering rich learning experiences for students in reading and numeracy. I have to congratulate Mrs Lofthouse, Mr Morrison, Mrs Patten and Mrs Murray for fantastic growth in these areas!

EXTENAL ASSESSMENTS

To strengthen our analysis and understanding of student growth in learning, we will be undertaking a number of external assessments from Term 4 of this year. These tests are conducted by the University of NSW (UNSW). Student data is kept completely confidential. Below is a brief description of these tests. If you would like any further information, please see Mr Welham at school.

ICAS: Recognise and reward academic excellence. Students demonstrate a deeper, integrated and thorough level of learning based on the curricula for the relevant year. Students who undertake this test will be identified by the school using internal and NAPLAN data (Years 2 to 6 only).

REACH: Reach Assessments are annual progression assessments which provide an external, objective benchmark of learner progress. We are looking at delivering REACH Assessments for all students in Years 2 to 6 from 2020 onwards.

JET: Jet Assessments provides our teachers with instant, thorough and reliable data. Teachers use this data to immediately tailor their teaching to suit the needs of their learners. Students are required to reflect on their results and to use the information to co-construct learning goals with their teacher. All Primary students will be undertaking a JET Assessment for Grammar and Punctuation in Term 4 of this year.
